Looking back over the years, we take pride in the remarkable strides and achievements our school has made in a relatively short span. We celebrate the fact that our school has established its own standard of excellence in the realm of education.

CMI Public School is dedicated to achieving an international standard of excellence while maintaining a harmonious balance between tradition and modernity. Remaining true to the values set by St. Chavara Kuriakose Elias, we continue on the journey towards cultivating a new paradigm of education that meets international standards. Our curriculum is designed to provide research-oriented, activity-oriented, and family-oriented learning. Through project presentations, students engage in extensive research on assigned topics, fostering a mindset of lifelong learning.

International Activities

International Activities are intended to enhance a peep into the larger and better scenario of learning. The Recognition of International Dimensions in Schools (RIDS) action plan for seven projects was approved by the British council in the year 2025.

Our students appeared for the PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test) for Grade 8, 9 and 10 which is conducted by the College Board, USA.

1. Academics

Academic excellence is given prime importance in this school. We assure academic excellence through periodical tests, assessments, projects, seminars, and open houses. We were able to keep up the tradition of attaining excellent results in the CBSE exams this year too. In the XIIth Grade Board exam our students bagged 100% distinction. For Grade X it was a sweeping victory with 90.8 % distinction, 100% first class and 13 students secured full A1. The school topper was Ms. Maria K. S. with 99% from the 10th grade, and from the 12th grade Master Benito Thomas of the Science stream with 95.4%, Master Mathew Abraham from the Commerce stream with 97.6%. Maria K. S. and Sanjeev Sijil scored a centum in Malayalam. Maria K. S., Riya Reji, Sanjeev Sijil, Jennifer Jeson, Nobel Varghese, Nora Josy, Alan John Ajaks, Evelyn Joy, Riona Rubise and Stephy Salu scored a centum in Social. Maria K. S., Riya Reji, Jennifer Jeson, Nobel Varghese, Nora Josy, Alan John Ajaks, Nilay Krishna, Parvana Praveen, Dyna Ajith, Keerthi Regive, Ashish Binoj K., Aeden P Leyon, Joel George Lopez and Joseph Naiju scored a centum in I T.

Mathew Abraham, Aaron Rigo, Avin Tom Shibu and Avanthikaa Mohandas Vishnudas scored a centum in Business Studies. Chris T Mathew secured a centum in Physics. John Jaison secured a centum in IP.

These students were awarded the meritorious student trophy by the Chalakudy MLA, Mr. Saneesh Kumar Joseph. It is the proof of hard work and perseverance of the CMI School family that we had such good results in the board exam for Grade X and Grade XII for the past years.

2. Sports

We give due prominence to sports and games in our curriculum. Training for sports is given during the sports period. Special coaching is given for swimming and football. The fun games play an important role in refreshing the mind and giving physical activity to the children.

The Central Kerala Sahodaya Athletic Championship was held at Carmel CMI Public School, Vazhakulam on 23rd, 24th and 25th October. A total of 64 students participated in various events in various categories. Our school secured the Second Runners Up with 177 points. George Joseph secured the individual championship in the junior category. We secured the Overall first position in Sub Junior Boys category and Overall Second position in Sub junior girls category.

The Central Kerala Senior Sahodaya Football Tournament (under 19) was hosted in our School on 5th and 6th of November. We were the champions. Savio Shiju was the Best Player of the Tournament, Juan Felix was the Promising Player, Erick Justin was the Man of the Match and Raihan Rasheed was the Best Defender.

Central Kerala Sahodaya Football Tournament (under 14 boys) was held at Holy Angel's Public School, Pothanicadu. We were the Champions. Fabian Diaz Geo was the Best Defender and Seno Leo was the Best Player of the Tournament.

The Central Kerala Sahodaya Skating Competition was hosted at St. Thomas Public School, Perumbavoor. Our school secured the second runner up. Ann Shaju emerged as the Individual Champion in the junior category.

CMI Mini World Cup (Seniors) was hosted in our school on October 9th and the champions were Christ Vidyanikethan, Irinjalakuda.

Our students made us proud with their remarkable achievements in sports this year. At the FRSI Thrissur Skating Clash – Zone B, CMI Chalakudy emerged as the Winners, and in the Peace Kick-Off Season–2 held at Peace International School, Paravur, our team secured the Runners-Up position. These victories highlight the hard work of our students and the dedicated support of their coaches.

3. Seminars & Projects

We give the opportunity to the children to present a seminar on relevant topics of their choice. The best presentations are compiled and released as “Facets of the World Around us”. This year, the final round of the seminar was held on November 26th. The first prize was bagged by Keerthy Rejeev of Grade X, second prize by Evelyn Joy of Grade X and the third prize was shared by Evana Paulvy of Grade X and Hannah Ann Leejo of Grade IX.

Our students carry out two projects in each term. They do seven projects in a year including two international projects.

4. Co-curricular Activities

We follow a curriculum incorporating curricular and co-curricular activities in a balanced manner which provides ample opportunities for the students to develop their potential and improve their abilities. Co-curricular activities include Seminar, Projects, Exhibitions, Debates, Quiz bowl, and Public Speaking. The music academy affiliated to Chetana Music Academy provides training in vocal and instrumental music.

Training is also provided in classical dance. Classes for Yoga, Karate, Roller skating, Aerobics, drums, Organ, Violin and Guitar, are also conducted regularly. Painting, drawing, and SUPW classes give the students an opportunity to polish their talents. Classes in Crafts, Chess, Abacus, Badminton, Basketball, Table Tennis and Lawn Tennis are also being conducted.

There are 6 clubs in our school which conduct many fruitful projects. They are the Read & Grow Club, Eco Club, Disaster Management Club, Heritage & Tourism

Club, Health & Wellness Club and Adolescence Club. The students of Grade XI and XII are given training in basic mechanics required in their life. The Eco club promotes Spiritual Farming, a cult of farming which aims at preparing the earth to its original nature devoid of anything harmful to the soil.

Arts Fest, Literary and Cultural competitions of our school were conducted in the month of July.

The Central Kerala Sahodaya Arts Fest was held at Vimala Public School, Thodupuzha. Our students participated in various on-stage and off- stage items. 5. Exhibitions

Exhibitions are conducted regularly on different subjects to enhance the knowledge, skill and creativity of the students. This year we were able to conduct nine such fruitful exhibitions.

6. Field trips and Excursions

Excursions and Field trips help the students grow in team spirit and become familiar with nature and the surroundings. This year, the classes were assigned to visit places of social, industrial and political relevance and natural beauty. Each class will be going for four field trips. The students of Grade X and Grade XII visited Mysore and Coorg.

7. Festivals

Celebrations and festivals are a part and parcel of our activities. This year the celebrations started with 'Parents' Day' which was celebrated on 20th September, 2025. Grades IX, X, XI & XII rocked the stage which made everyone spellbound. We

celebrated Independence Day, Teacher's Day and Children's Day in a befitting manner.

This year the exciting 'Food Day' was celebrated on 4th October. It was included in the curriculum with the intention of providing knowledge and instruction in the basic culinary skills one should possess. Special focus and training are given to Grades VI to XII to have them well-equipped with the art of cooking on completion of their schooling.

8. Spiritual Activities

Spirituality is given prime importance among all the activities in the school. Holy Mass is celebrated every month and on Feast Days. Each class gets an opportunity to lead the offertory and prayers. The Feast of our Lady of Mount Carmel and Feast of St. Chavara are celebrated with devotional prayers and veneration. Each month our students learn about a virtue as the topic for public speaking and those who practice the virtue get certificates.

9. Literary Cultural Activities

The literary skills of the students are encouraged through the Kid's News Letter. The Notice Board Competitions on relevant topics and events encourage the children to find out and display reports and dates of major events. The students organise and conduct the Class Cultural Programme and the Family Get-together which promote their initiative and skill in coordinating and conducting programmes. Read Aloud programmes and competitions are conducted regularly to enhance the reading skills of students.

10. The 16th All Kerala Chavara Kuriakose Elias Painting Competition.

The All Kerala Chavara Kuriakose Elias Painting Competition to commemorate St. Chavara, the founder of the CMI Congregation was conducted successfully on 8th November. Around 1800 students from different schools participated in the competition and all the participants were given a gift pack.

11.Social Service Programme

We keep up a tradition of helping the poor and needy. As part of the Snehasparsham CMI CHILD CARE FOUNDATION we provide medical aid to the poor and needy children in our neighbourhood who suffer from acute diseases. Providing a glimmer of hope to the children struggling to survive, the CMI CHILD CARE FOUNDATION 'SNEHASPARSAM' is an annual feature.

We have also allotted fee concessions to meritorious students who are financially insecure. Our students donate books on the Vidyarambam Day and Carmel Day which are distributed to the needy students in the locality.
